

# Guidelines for Seed Exchange on February 25<sup>th</sup>

At the February 25 annual meeting members are invited to bring native seed to share. Bring seeds sorted and labeled. You might want to include where it was gathered, and any tips on growing conditions.

If you want to take, bring envelopes or small bags and a marker. Take only the quantity you want to plant this year. Extra seeds can be donated. If there is a small amount of seed, leave some for others. Some seeds are very small and a little goes a long way if conditions are right.
