## **Early Deadline for Plant Orders**

Wild Ones Fox Valley Area Chapter's (WOFVA) spring plant sale has some slightly different structure this year.

- Orders: Plant sale orders must be in by March 20th, that's earlier than past years.
- **Pick up:** Plant sale order pick up is **May 20<sup>th</sup>** at the WILD Center, 2285 Butte des Morts Beach Rd, Neenah, WI 54956, one week later than past years.
- **Plant Trail Sale:** We are coordinating our plant sale with the Outagamie Master Gardeners' and the Paper Valley Garden Club's plant sales in what we are calling the Plant Trail Sale. All three organizations are holding their plant sales on the same day, so you can visit their sales all in one day.

Outagamie Master Gardeners' sale will feature vegetables. More information ocmga.net.

**Paper Valley Garden Club's** sale features typically non-native perennials. More information **papervalleygardenclub.com**.

WOFVA native plants will continue to be in 4-inch pots and sell for \$5.00 each unless you buy a tray of 12 or more of the same species, then they're \$4.50 each.

## Learning at Eagle Days

January soars with Eagle Days Along the Fox. January 14<sup>th</sup> marked the mid-winter survey and reception at Atlas Waterfront Cafe. Nearly fifty monitors were dispersed over twenty designated sites to count eagles. The WILD Center was one of those monitoring sites. Donna VanBuecken, who was at the WILD Center, reported seeing two adults and at least one immature flying from the nest area to the south of the property. Dave Peck, who has monitored the WILD Center for the past eight seasons, opening it for post-monitoring socialization, was covering Kimberly Point Park. He saw four eagles. While these numbers might not seem impressive, many monitors reported seeing over ten of these majestic birds during the ninety minute period with a high of twenty sitings at Expera. Based on the data, the DNR estimated there were just over two hundred eagles vacationing along the Fox on that day.

The excitement continued on the 21<sup>st</sup> with a bird hike at 8AM and indoor presentations at two locations: Paper Discovery Center and Neenah Library. Approximately five hundred people took part in these family oriented events. Young and old alike were able to see live birds compliments of Bemis, Corporation from Raptor Education Groups in Antigo and Aves Wildlife in Neenah. Participants not only got to see raptors up close but also learn about the dangers they face due to lead poisoning and pesticide use.

In addition to the raptor education programs, DNR Wildlife Biologist, Steve Easterly, spoke about his work in monitoring eagle nests in Northeast Wisconsin via flight, and Christine Williams took us back in time to learn about the history of the locks system and the families that ran them. Both locations also provided opportunities for participants and families to learn about eagles through interactive activities.



Eagles reside along the river throughout the year, but the heaviest concentration is in the winter. Visit **eagledaysalongthefox.org** for detailed map of key viewing sites. Also, there are two opportunities to monitor yet this season - Saturday, February 11<sup>th</sup> and March 11<sup>th</sup>. ## **Help with Picking Native Plants**

If you're looking for some help in creating a garden design or simply picking plants, here are some suggestions for you.

- To begin, survey your site or look at photos, consider bloom times and colors, put your design down on paper and then prepare your order. There is a good section on design in the Wild Ones Landscaping with Native Plants book, both editions. You can find printed copies at the WILD Center Store or at archive. epa.gov/greenacres/web/pdf/wo\_2004b.pdf and archive.epa.gov/greenacres/web/html/index-8.html
- 2. WOFVA continues to work toward saving America's favorite butterfly through the Wild for Monarchs campaign, and we also promote efforts to save our pollinators through gardening with native plants. Plan to attend the monthly chapter programs to learn more about native plants, natural landscaping and biodiversity or check out some of the Wild for Monarchs campaign materials.
