November Program Was A Buzzin'

Nearly 50 people attended our November program about Bees in our Backyard, which was co-hosted by Winnebago Audubon. About half of the folks were not members of either group, but interest in bees and beekeeping brought them to learn what they could from Andy Krueger. Andy is a local gardener and beekeeper whose enthusiasm

for honey bees is contagious. College students, those thinking about becoming beekeepers, experienced beekeepers, and gardeners, all had lots of questions for Andy. Did you know that one honey bee makes only 1/12th teaspoon of honey in its short life? Honey bees only live six months and may travel up to six miles to visit 50–100 flowers during a collection trip. Something to think about this summer while working in your native plant garden.

- LaLuzerne Property, 4238 Pouwels Ct., De Pere, WI 54115, 4 miles south of East De Pere – 101 species of native trees and shrubs (and dozens of native grasses, flowers and water plants) have been planted over a 36 year period on what was a barren corn field. Combined with a lake, structures and stream, this property is a living example of the recreation of a beautiful natural habitat.
- Mead Property, 3283 West Point Rd., Green Bay, WI 54313 This 7 acre property on the west edge of Green Bay has 2 acres of prairie. The prairie was planted in 1996 and is maintained by mowing each spring. There is a small wetland and creek. Native trees planted are: Tamarack, Eastern Red Cedar, Basswood, Paper Birch, Locust, Aspen, Red Maple and Red and White Oak among others. Interesting shrubs have been included. A mowed trail system allows easy access through the property.
