Increase your knowledge and skills in botany, ecology, conservation, and uses of native vegetation in Wisconsin! These new courses are taught by highly qualified instructors and held all around the state throughout the year.

You can take the courses individually or earn a certification in Wisconsin native plants by taking 40-hours of courses and completing a 10-hour capstone project of your choice. The courses do not have to be taken in order and there is no time limit to finish the certification requirements.



Core Courses 2023 (18 hours required):

- 9/11 and 9/18 Native Plant Form and Function (6 hrs - blended, UW-Stevens Point)
- 10/28 Establishing and Maintaining Native Plant Communities (6 hrs - UW Oshkosh)

Elective Courses 2023 (your choice - 22 hours needed):

- 9/30 Exploring the Fungal World (6 hrs - in person, UWO - Fox Cities campus)
- 10/1 The Prairie in Seed (5 hours - in person, Pope Farm Conservancy, Middleton)
- 10/20-10/22 Finding Your Connection with Nature (4 hrs - Lowenwood (the old Conserve School), Land O' Lakes, WI)
- 10/21 Terrestrial Invasive Species Management (6 hrs - in person, Heckrodt Wetland Reserve, Menasha)
- 11/11 The Ultimate Hummingbird Garden (3 hours - in person, UW-Oshkosh)
- 12/2 Wisconsin Forests (5 hrs - in person, Ledgeview Nature Center)
