## Wisconsin Native Plant Certification

Fox Valley Area Wild Ones proudly offers a 50-hour certificate in WI native plants. It is designed to expand knowledge of botany, ecology, conservation, and uses of native flora in Wisconsin. Participants will get both classroom education and hands-on application to increase knowledge and skills that can be applied at home, in the community, or at work. The course setting will provide a common ground for native plant enthusiasts to meet and connect with others who share their interests. The program is designed to benefit home gardeners, landscapers, teachers, and other professionals. See our website for further detailed information regarding cost, scholarships and course overview.

## Grants

Natural Landscapes for Tomorrow fund grants ranging from \$100-\$500 to our Chapter area (serving the counties of Calumet, Fond du Lac, Green Lake, Outagamie, Waushara, Waupaca and Winnebago) public schools, houses of worship, and other public and not-for-profit organizations who wish to create natural landscapes or outdoor classrooms using native plants. A 50% funding match is required.

In 2024, 200 acres of drained agricultural land was converted to a mosaic of restored ephemeral and perennial wetlands, including a groundwater fen and habitats to protect water quality and provide habitat for pollinators, songbirds, and waterfowl.
